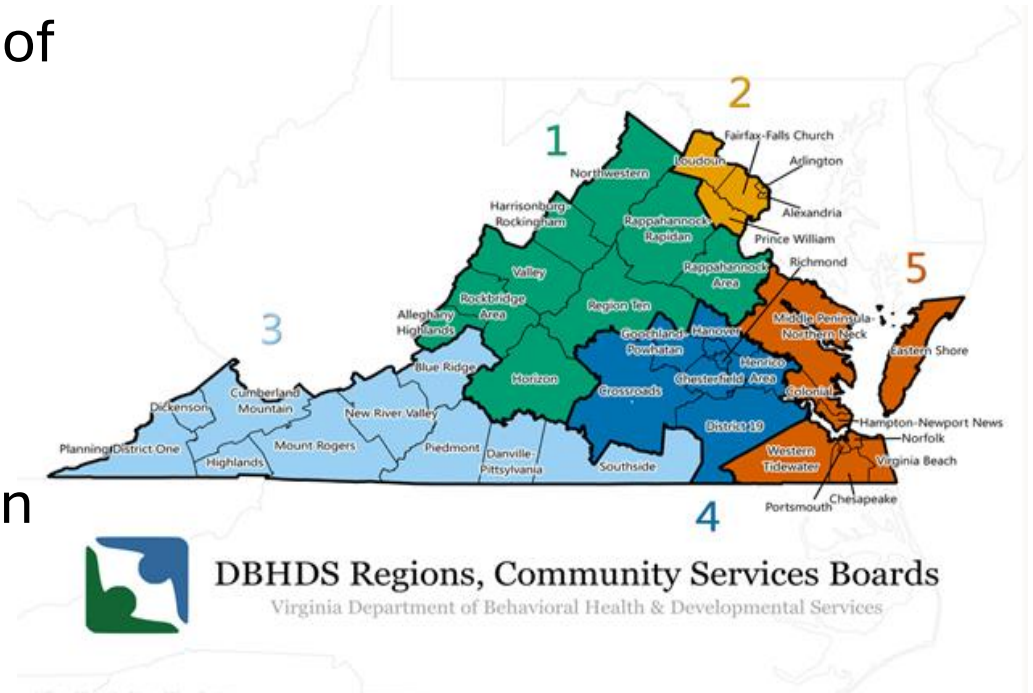

Community Services Boards (CSB)

- CSBs are responsible for ensuring the delivery of community-based services to individuals with mental health, substance use, and developmental disability needs.
- CSBs serve as the single point of entry for access to state facilities through pre-admission screening, case management, service coordination, and discharge planning.

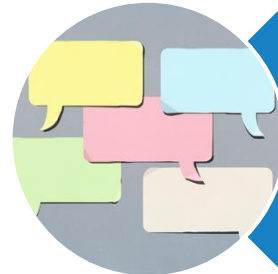

Our Services

Same Day Access (Adults and Children)

- Access to an initial screening for services without an appointment. Persons can walk in and be assessed on that same day for clinically appropriate services.

Crisis Services

- Crisis Services – 24/7 response for adults and children in behavioral health crisis
- Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) – Partnership with law enforcement to improve crisis response and safety through training opportunities

Developmental Services (Adults and Children)

- Intellectual Disability and Developmental Disability Case Management
- Waiver screening and waitlist monitoring

Children, Youth and Family Services

- **Mental Health Services**
 - **Mental Health Case Management** – Coordinated support and linking children with, or at risk of, serious emotional disturbance to community resources by supporting caretakers in the process
 - **Mental Health Therapy** – Individual and family therapy offered in-person and virtually
 - **School Based Therapy** – Partnership with local schools to provide onsite therapy
- **Family Support Partnership** – Trained family support partners with lived experience in caring for a child with serious emotional disturbance, supporting the caretaker while the child receives services
- **Medication Management** – Psychiatric evaluation and ongoing medication oversight as part of team-based care
- **Prevention** – Early intervention and education offered throughout the communities to promote resilience and prevent behavioral health challenges before they begin
- **Collaborative therapist positions** with the local Juvenile Detention Center and the Department of Juvenile Probation
- **Partnership with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC)**

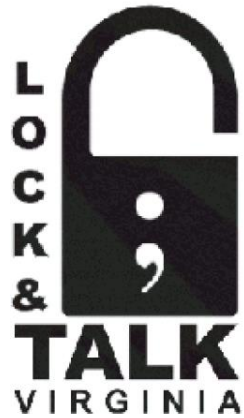
Our Services

Adult Services

- **Mental Health Services**
 - **Mental Health Case Management** – Coordinated support and linking persons with serious mental illness to community resources
 - **Mental Health Therapy** – Offered in-person or via telehealth in every location
 - **Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)** – Multidisciplinary team that provides intensive community-based supports to individuals with serious mental illness
 - **Psychiatric Rehabilitation Services (Clubhouse)** – Sunshine House and Our Family – promote skill building and social engagement for adults with serious mental illness
 - **Housing Services** – Assistance securing and maintaining stable housing for persons with serious mental illness or pregnant and parent women with substance use and mental illness challenges
- **Peer Support** – Certified peers offer support by way of training and lived experience in both mental health and substance use programs
- **Within Reach Peer Recovery Center** – A Winchester based drop-in center for individuals struggling with mental health challenges
- **Jail Services** – Provide case management and forensic discharge planning for community-based care upon release
- **Substance Use Services**
 - **Substance Use Case Management** – Coordinated support and linking adults with substance use to community resources
 - **Substance Use Therapy** – Group and Individual therapy offered in-person or via telehealth
 - **Office Based Opioid Treatment** – Medication assisted treatment combined with counseling and case management
 - **Recovery Court Collaboration** – Therapy, case management and peer support for participants in local recovery courts
- **Medication Management** – Psychiatric evaluation and ongoing medication oversight
- **Prevention and Wellness Services** – Works closely with community coalitions to provide education, support, and training around suicide awareness, substance use and overdose, and problem gambling.

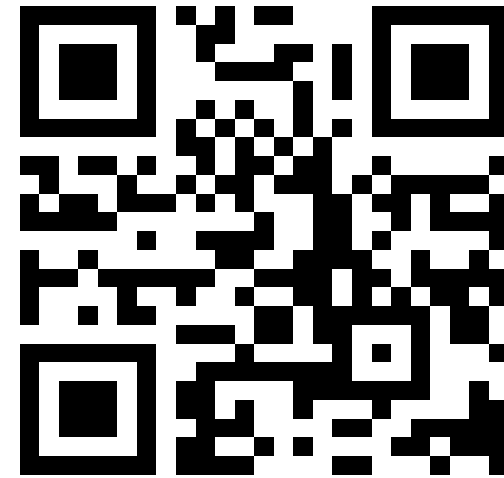
